NPQs: February cohort

Applications to register for a National Professional Qualification with a February start, are currently still open. However, the deadline to register your interest and finish the application for this course is **18th January 2022.**

The NPQ framework provides a 'golden thread' throughout every stage of a teacher's career and include more professional development options for teachers and school leaders to keep getting better. In partnership with Ambition, we are proud to offer the following NPQs;

Please note that filling in the expression of interest does not confirm your place on the programme, so please look out for further emails from us and Ambition regarding the completion of the sign-up process; please also check your junk inbox. There can be no extensions with the deadline and once the 18th January has past, we will not be able to accept any extra participants, so we recommend completing applications at the earliest convenience.

Our November programmes started very successfully with the introductory conferences for each NPQ; **100%** of participants said that the quality of training was either **good or very good**, with **87%** rating the quality of training as **very good**.

All of our NPQ courses are now **fully-funded** for **all teachers** within **state schools**!

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MFL in KS3: Developing a culture of practice which leads to fluency

Building on the recommendations from the 2016 TSC MFL Pedagogy Review this course will explore how Language teachers can adapt their practice in KS3 to focus on fluency leading to improved student efficacy and outcomes.

This course is designed to ensure MFL teachers have a strong theoretical understanding of the factors underpinning improved student outcomes in KS3. Course participants will have an opportunity to practise and refine their classroom practice as well as developing a bespoke strategic plan for languages in KS3 in their own school.

This course will be led by Tracy Williams, MFL SLE and the ATLP's Teaching and Learning Lead with additional input from three experienced teachers with expertise in French, Spanish and German.

Run over a period of four months, the course will comprise 5 face to face sessions, self-directed study and 2 coaching conversations.
