This half term, our Teaching School Hub CPD programme has started with an exciting collaboration with the Research School network to deliver Making a Difference for Disadvantaged Pupils. With over 50 sign-ups, we are now at capacity, but it has shown us that there is a clear need for research-led programmes of this nature. In addition, our secondary MFL programme, with its bespoke coaching element, is also improving MFL pedagogy in secondary school classrooms.


