
Teacher Degree Apprenticeship (TDA)

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Degree apprenticeships



Degree apprenticeships are growing. 46,800 degree level apprenticeship starts in 2022/23.

Used by major employers, including the NHS, Rolls-Royce, Metropolitan Police, Sellafield, MOD, Airbus, PWC, Deloitte, as well as local authorities and universities.


Increasingly seen as a high-quality route to professional occupations.


The Teacher Degree Apprenticeship (TDA) will be a new route into teaching

The Teacher Degree Apprenticeship will be a high quality and attractive route into teaching



The new route will appeal to a wide range of aspiring teachers

School leavers

An alternative route into teaching for those that learn best through vocational training, with employment duties including a gradual scaling up of teaching practice over the course of the 4 year apprenticeship.

Teaching assistants

Teaching assistants will bring experience of school environments and confidence working with children as teacher apprentices.

Career changers

Valuable experience will be brought into classrooms.

All candidates will have the opportunity to earn while they learn and avoid student debt associated with traditional university routes.

What do potential candidates think?

We recently conducted some user research to understand why this route is appealing and whether there are any potential barriers

We found that...

- All participants in this research would be interested in doing the TDA
- Being able to earn a salary whilst training and getting in classroom teaching experience is appealing
- Location of workplace and ITT provider is key
- Salary range is important

"In school training is better, so yes, doing the TDA would be better for me"

What is the funding pilot?

What is the funding pilot?

Alongside the wider TDA rollout, we announced a funding pilot



We have launched a funding pilot in secondary mathematics to gauge the impact of salary grant funding on recruitment to the TDA.



This will be delivered by eight pilot providers who will recruit up to 150 candidates.



Pilot providers also received separate grant funding to support with the costs of course development and candidate recruitment.



This will be targeted at schools who employ maths trainees on this pilot. Recruitment began in autumn 2024, and training will commence in autumn 2025.

Throughout the pilot we will monitor interest and recruitment using data from our digital services.
